Alice Gaida, a graduate in medical records last year attained a 94 in the National Registration Examination for Medical Record Librarians. This is the highest mark ever recorded among the graduates from this College. Ann Bigelow and Patricia Thibadeau followed, each with 93. Rita Kummet, and Mary Milek, both graduates of 1940 who took the examination with last year's class, rated 93 and 92 respectively.

Although the test was taken last October, the results were just announced. The examination marks the completion of the training period in the course and registers a girl as a recognized medical record librarian.
