College gym courses will be offered for freshman and sophomore status students on Monday and Wednesday evenings. Regulation attire includes “bloomers, white middies and gym slippers” to attend the course. An archery range was set up and available for those in the gym course as well as those to use after 7 pm at the completion of athletic practices.
